Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will:

- Have opportunities to think about what makes places and people special.
- Discuss issues around Improving our environment and caring for all creatures.
- Learn about our Christian value friendship through stories and role play.
- Investigate growing and changing, including human life stages, plants, animals and humans and getting bigger.

Communication and Language

Children will:

- Share experiences and ideas during class discussion.
- Have the opportunity to engage in creative role play games.
- Listening attentively to a speaker.
- Practising our questioning skills asking and answering how and why questions.
- Investigate and explore all living things through curiosity, questioning and observations.

Physical Development

Children will:

- Fine motor control practise busy fingers morning animal groups.
- Have access to the natural wild wood climbing equipment in the playground as well as large tyres.
- Learn actions to the song Let it grow.
- Continue to take part in 2 PE sessions per week.
- Have access to writing resources inside and outside e.g., Pens, pencils, paper, and book making materials.

Mathematics

Children will:

- Explore what to do when something is missing; initially the whole but moving on to working out a missing part.
- Understand values to 20 focusing on (10-20)
- Explore doubling and halving

Understanding of the World

Children will:

- Investigate the conditions that support life for plants by conducting an experiment and then planting sunflowers.
- Learn about a variety of life cycles including butterfly, plants and chicks.
- Learn the conditions that support life for animals put this into practise by looking after our Class 1 chicks.
- Explore human growth and investigate how we stay fit and healthy.

Literacy

Children will:

- Have daily phonics sessions Beginning phase 3 and practise writing simple sentences remembering to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.
- Take part in weekly shared reading sessions.
- Take part in group guided reading sessions.
- Learn about fronted adverbials to order the life cycle of a hen.
- Write instructions for planting seeds.
- Have to the opportunity to listen and join in with a variety of stories, including Brenda's boring egg and Handa's surprise.

Expressive art and Design

Children will:

- Design, make and evaluate their own fruit salad.
- Acting out a story.
- Experimenting with different tools.
- Use a variety of musical instruments to make music and play music along with singing for our class performance.
