

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will:

- Learn about rights and responsibilities including looking after our special people, helping in the classroom and at home and caring for our world.
- Begin to become more independent and confident in their own abilities.
- Learn how to respect others and themselves.
- Christian values, respect. Through the eyes of various story characters.

Communication and Language

Children will

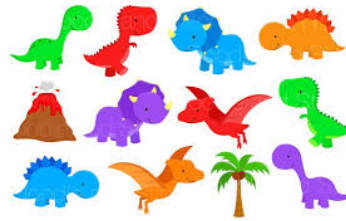
- Take part in a Mystery egg activity where children will have the opportunity to discuss, question and observe a giant egg.
- Participate in role play activities in the Class 1 Jurassic base camp play area.
- Increase vocabulary through books, stories, conversations and word of the week.
- Have the opportunity to engage with the dinosaur small world play.
- Actively play with their peers during child-initiated time.
- Increase vocabulary through books, stories, conversations and word of the week.

Physical Development

Children will:

- Fine motor control practise busy fingers morning animal groups.
- Have access to the natural wild wood climbing equipment in the playground as well as large tyres.
- Learn the dinosaur stomp dance.
- Continue to take part in 2 PE sessions per week.
- Have access to writing resources inside and outside e.g., Pens, pencils, paper, book making materials.

Literacy

Children will:

- Explore a mixture of fiction and non-fiction books including How to grow a dinosaur.
- Create missing posters to support a mystery egg activity.
- Work in groups to create our own Class 1 Non-fiction book about dinosaurs.
- Have daily phonics sessions – Phase 3 and practise writing simple sentences remembering to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.
- Take part in 3 x reading practise sessions.

Mathematics

Children will:

- Learning the positions of number 0-10.
- Developing a deeper understanding that numbers are made up of other numbers and beginning to rehearse number bonds.
- Combining parts to make a whole and using the part, whole model to develop an understanding of addition.

Understanding of the World

Children will:

- Explore the characteristics of a variety of dinosaurs, including what they eat, how they protect themselves. Looking at why dinosaurs became extinct.
- Comparing prehistoric animals to existing animals.
- Learn the story of St Patricks Day and join in with St Patricks day celebrations - 17th March
- Learning about Lent and Easter.

Expressive art and Design

Children will:

- Create fossils using air dough and a variety of resources.
- Create Easter Cards.
- Freely use the creative area where they will have access to paint, Sellotape, glue and recycling for junk modelling
- Celebrating pancake day by making and tasting pancakes.
